#### **Albion's Annual Juneteenth Celebration**

#### "Learning about what was can help improve our present" - Councilwoman and Juneteenth Organizer, Lenn Reid

Juneteenth, or Emancipation Day, holds great significance in American history as it commemorates the end of slavery in the United States. It memorializes the time in 1856 when the last enslaved people in Galveston. Texas received word of the Emancipation Proclamation and therefore, their freedom. Now, more than ever, it is important that we share, reflect, and understand our nation's history.

In 2005, the state of Michigan declared the third Saturday of June the state recognized Juneteenth National Freedom Day.

Albion's Juneteenth celebration began in 2006 when Carrie Anderson organized a celebration in her home. Anderson was originally from Texas and wanted to share her celebration with more of the community. Over the years, the celebration grew into an event that spanned from McAuliffe to Holland Park.







Although Anderson has since past, her legacy of Juneteenth celebrations continues with the hard work of community leaders such as Councilwoman Lenn Reid.

This year, the celebration begins at 6PM Friday, June 20<sup>th</sup> at Harris Field with a free baseball game – the Playright Sports Academy youth team will be playing two baseball games, one against the Battle Creek Tigers and the other against the Battle Creek Black Soxes. This community event is free to attend with concessions available for purchase.

The celebration continues at 11AM on Saturday, June 21st in Holland Park, Reflection. entertainment, and food will be available in the park with a community reflection beginning at 11AM in the Dr. Harry Bonner Pavilion. Afterwards, explore the numerous vendors in the park ranging from community organizations to local artisans and food trucks. The Calhoun County Health Department will be there to provide health screens and access. Live music will begin at 1PM and continue with the annual Gospel Fest starting at 4PM. All are encouraged to attend.

## Color Our World with Albion District Library this Summer!

Summer is here and that means ADL's annual summer reading challenge is too! It's kicking off on June 7<sup>th</sup>, get ready to read to win. Head of Public Services, Andy Myers, emphasized that the goal of a summer reading challenge is to "create positive reading experiences".

## First Round of Grants in 2025

The Albion Community Foundation is excited to announce the first grantees of 2025. In the first round of the year, grantee projects range from community music to youth programming, and over \$55,000 was awarded! This first round of grantees include Albion Community Gardens, City of Albion, Fluence Arts Organization, Friends of the Bohm Theatre, Greater Albion Chamber of Commerce, INNOVATE Albion, Junior Achievement of the Michigan Great Lakes, Inc, MI Crossroads Council, Scouting America, and Walk the Beat Albion. Here are a few of the programs being funded.

## **Albion Community Gardens** *Garden Improvement Plan*

With the need for accessible and healthy food increasing in our community, the Albion Community Gardens is working to expand their programming to support the community more. Since 2017, the Gardens has been growing fresh food for the community, now they will be increasing production and reach. The grant funds will support the development of a composting system and compost to improve garden production, as well as organizational items for better access to tools and supplies. Albion Community Gardens received \$3,078 from the Fund for Greater Albion.





## **City of Albion** *Harris Field Revitalization*

Harris Field is a 5.1-acre park on Albion's west side and one of the city's operational baseball/softball field, serving youth and adult leagues. The grant funds will further enhance safety and usability by replacing steel doors for the concession stand, maintenance room, and restrooms, upgrading bathroom fixtures, installing a new scoreboard, constructing a press box, and improving field conditions with new infield sand and bases. The City of Albion was awarded \$10,000 from the Fund for Greater Albion.

#### **Walk the Beat Albion**

#### 2025 Walk the Beat Albion Music Education Program

Walk The Beat Albion is an all-volunteer non-profit organization dedicated to enriching lives through the power of music in the greater Albion community. Part of Walk the Beat Albion's work and dedication to the Albion community is providing educational music opportunities to Albion's youth by providing free musical instruments and lessons to children ages 6-21 in the greater Albion area. They were awarded \$2,500 from the Youth Fund will directly support the music opportunities in Albion.


