Memorable Service -Caroline Hurteau's Work with Kids 'N' Stuff Children's Museum

Since January 2020, Caroline Hurteau has been a Kids 'N' Stuff Children's Museum Board Member. Little did she know that just a few months after joining a global pandemic would drastically change how a hands-on children's museum operates.

The Covid-19 Pandemic created countless unknowns for everyone including a small and impactful children's museum nestled in the heart of downtown Albion, Michigan. Hurteau viewed this time for the museum as a "make it or break it" situation, and she was not going to give up. The museum went into "hibernation", and that easily could have been the end to the beloved non-profit. However, Hurteau held the mindset of trying anything, and at that time if it was your idea, you needed to implement it. So that's what she. With Hurteau's leadership, the museum's Board created at-home experiences and community activities that kept Kids 'N' Stuff Children's Museum relevant to families, donors, community members, and beyond. It wasn't all smooth sailing, but due to all their efforts, the museum was able to open their doors up again to the public in June of 2021.

Around this same time, a new focus emerged that Hurteau led the charge on – a new water table. Hurteau helped bring back the Bids 'N' Stuff Auction, the museum's annual fundraiser, and successfully raised over \$100,000 for the new table. The motivation has always been the same for Hurteau – wanting to see Kids 'N' Stuff not only survive but thrive and grow over the years.





Hurteau became the Board Chair in 2022 continuing her impactful leadership in new endeavors like helping to the hire the current Executive Director, Katie Gigliotti. Gigliotti has brought a vision and dedication to Kids 'N' Stuff that has pushed the Board, including Hurteau to be better.

As Hurteau concludes her second term on the Board, she shared some thoughts on what it means to be a good board member at any organization - feeling responsible for the wellbeing of the organization, continuously growing to a better future, actively engaging beyond meetings, and lastly, being a champion for the organization in all aspects of your life. Hurteau is excited to see what the future holds for Kids 'N' Stuff in the next 25 years including the continuation of amazing staff, activating more Kids 'N' Stuff spaces, and increasing offerings to the community.

Albion Area Philanthropic Women Are Reaching New Highs with 3/4 Million Dollars Donated

The Albion Area Philanthropic Women's giving circle is one of the most impactful community led initiatives in the Albion area. Since inception in 2007, around 100 Albion women and supporters have gathered every quarter, each with a \$100 check, with the purpose of supporting a local non-profit. Their final 2025 meeting will push the organization to over \$750,000 donated to Albion non-profits!

During their meetings, the women hear from various presenting non-profits, who explain how they would use the approximate \$10,000. The women vote on the winner of that quarter's round. Previous recipients range from the Albion District Library to establish the Dolly Parton Imagination Library to the Forks Senior Center for technology upgrades, encompassing multiple facets of the community.


