She moved to Albion in 1955 to begin working for the family of Drs. Harold and Miriam Daly. From that point on, Main remained active in the Daly family.



Main spent most of her life in service to others. She helped raise the Daly children. She earned her GED and then went on to tutor other adult learners at the Albion Public Library's GED program, and she cared for people recovering from illnesses. Main helped at Red Cross blood drives, planted flowers for Citizens to Beautify Albion, and served in other civic organizations.

In honor of her life, the four endowment funds established are Grace Main Albion-Homer United Way Endowment, Grace Main Calhoun County American Red Cross Endowment, Grace Main Citizens to Beautify Albion Endowment, and Grace Main Girl Scouts Endowment. Each endowment was established to support an organization that Main was a passionate about.


